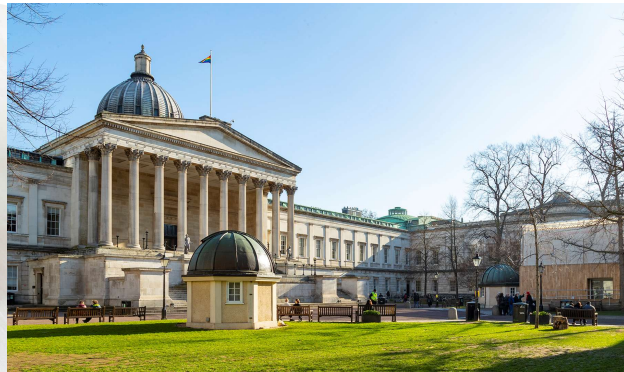

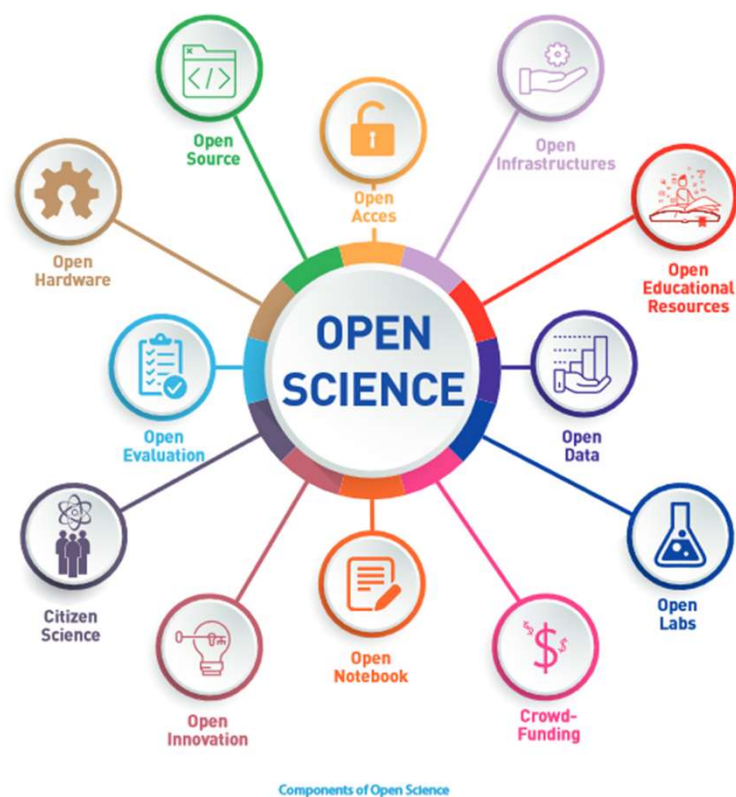


Office for Open Science & Scholarship

- UK – REF Impact and Environment agendas have been instrumental in shifting focus from publications to the benefits of research outside academia

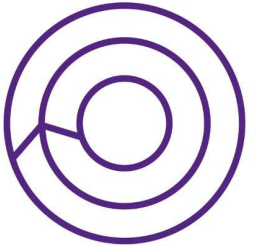

Citizen Science Certificate

- The Citizen Science Certificate is a non-academic certification which will be awarded to individuals who complete a programme of research training as part of the UCL Citizen Science Academy
- The Citizen Science Academy will offer rigorous, high-quality, and accessible education and training programmes focusing on practice-led, community-based learning
- Our goal is to equip citizens (and later voluntary and public sector organisations) with knowledge and practical skills about qualitative and quantitative research methods to support community empowerment, social action, and influence local decision-making
- Our focus is on delivering and supporting inclusive learning and research
