- How can we make publishing an open access book the norm rather than a box-ticking exercise?


What are the barriers preventing this culture change?



- Finances
 - A Book Processing Charge is currently the most common publishing model
 - Typically costs between £10,000 and £15,000
- Research Culture
- Lack of awareness and misconceptions

Approach taken by Lancaster University Library to facilitate this culture change




- Trailblazers scheme, an OA Book publishing initiative for Early Career Researchers




