



### My key message:

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

"With regards to price and format, the reason this book was published in hardback was because we saw it as a monograph, aimed principally at researchers rather than a student readership. Books with a broader student readership, or whose readership is primarily professional, are published as what we call dual editions – i.e. in both hardback and paperback. Having said that, we do publish a paperback edition of a monograph 12-18 months after the hardback comes out.

*Our hardbacks are priced at a relatively high price because they are aimed at the institutional library market. Libraries tend to buy bundles of our books, rather than individual titles, and so they don't actually pay the list price."*
