

## Neurotensin receptors in GtoPdb v.2023.1

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### Abstract

Neurotensin receptors (**nomenclature as recommended by NC-IUPHAR [39]**) are activated by the endogenous tridecapeptide neurotensin (pGlu-Leu-Tyr-Glu-Asn-Lys-Pro-Arg-Arg-Pro-Tyr-Ile-Leu) derived from a precursor ([NTS, 30990](#)), which also generates neuromedin N, an agonist at the NTS<sub>2</sub> receptor.

[<sup>3</sup>H]neurotensin ([human, mouse, rat](#)) and [<sup>125</sup>I]neurotensin ([human, mouse, rat](#)) may be used to label NTS<sub>1</sub> and NTS<sub>2</sub> receptors at 0.1-0.3 and 3-5 nM concentrations respectively.
